

Spiritual Adultery part 2

The book of "The Revelation of Jesus Christ" spoke of those "who follow the lamb wherever he goes", who "have not been defiled by women".

The scriptures as we see them translated into English was performed by a masculine Society. The English rendition of the scriptures is predominantly masculine. As a result all believers are referred to as him and rarely her. But scripture must be interpreted as gender-neutral because God is equally male and female, for "in the beginning God made man in His image and in His likeness made He them male and female.

2nd Corinthians 7 says to come out of her my people be separate do not touch what is unclean and **you shall be my son's in my daughters**, showing that God does not prefer one gender over the other.

So then when the Book of Revelation refers to "those who are not defiled by women", it is more appropriate to verbatim it as "those who have not committed adultery". Women are not intrinsically bad and men are not intrinsically good to give them preference in God's eyes over women.

Now to those who follow the lamb wherever he goes, who have not committed adultery. This adultery as spoken about throughout the Book of Revelation has nothing to do with male and female in human terms. There is a spiritual adultery that blinds you and keeps you from following the lamb. It is the interaction with the Mother of harlots and her replicants that qualifies one as an adulterer and one who commits spiritual adultery. This is a spiritual crime and a rejection against the things of God. This is this type of adultery that keeps you from following the Lamb, whether you are male or female.

With this being said, both male and female can follow the lamb wherever he goes, and both male and female can be adulterers of the things of God.

God did not single out the masculine to be preferred. If God had meant undefilement to be in human terms as a disqualifier to partake of Heavenly things, then Christ would not have offered salvation to the women at the well who had 4 husbands, and her current man was not her husband.

Salvation is offered universally without distinction to gender. Even as quoted from Galatians 3.²⁸ There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, **there is neither male nor female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus.**

Spiritual adultery is turning your back from the provisions of God offered through the gospel to the counterfeit provisions provided by those of the world. This is the adultery meant in scripture and the reason for the call to "come out of **her** my people, both male and female, lest you partake of **her** sins and receive of **her** plagues and her judgements. This is the "**her**" that is the woman that causes adultery and not a physical lady for a human man. That is not how you follow the lamb, but to abstain and cleanse yourselves by following Christ to become un-adulterated and distance yourself from the gods of this age .

To repent and be forgiven is how you acquire spiritual fidelity. Every human is in opposition to God until they begin this journey.

Paul was speaking about qualifications of becoming a minister and said "they must be husbands of one wife" not meaning they had previous marriages, but that they were monogamous. If previous marriages was a disqualifier, then any other previous sin would disqualify us as well and nobody could qualify to minister.

But this is a testimony to the forgiveness of sin by Christ, and our ability to be cleansed and purified from our old self as described here from the book of Titus "according to His mercy He saved us, through the washing of regeneration and renewing of the Holy Spirit, whom He poured out on us abundantly through Jesus Christ our Savior, that having been justified by His grace we should become heirs according to the hope of eternal life. This is a faithful saying". This is a saying that shows us the way to faithfulness, a place with no infidelity or adultery, our place "in Christ " free from adulterations.

All humans are born with an Adamic predisposition for sin. Nobody has a clean slate. Even those without a criminal record still have a guilty hearts, hence the scripture "if you even think your brother a fool, you are in judgment for hellfire". You are defiled.

So then how do we follow the lamb? Well I supposed to some it looks like we follow the sheep to the slaughter. But "he who seeks to save his life will lose it, and he who seeks to lose his life for Christ will save it."

And Romans 8.36 As it is written:

"For Your sake we are killed all day long;
We are accounted as sheep for the slaughter." ³⁷ Yet in all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us.

He who said "follow me that where I am you may be also" left us a path.

The Kingdom of God is at hand.
